

- Loosen set screws on sliding end of canopy frame at the back of the boat.
- Slide canopy end into frame to make frame shorter.
- Lift tarp up on top of frame, rest on center ridge tube.
- Starting at one end, roll tarp down the center of frame.
- Fold tarp out to each side.
- Pull tarp down over each end.
- Position tarp evenly on canopy frame.
- Slide the canopy end out, making the tarp fit snug. <u>DO NOT over-stretch cover</u>. If you over-stretch canopy tarp, you will rip out seams at corners.
- Tighten the set screws with ¾" wrench until the bolts are snug.
- Lace elastic cord through the D-rings around the perimeter. Cord should go to the outside of the canopy arms.
- Stretch the ends of the cord to meet and tie ends at one D-ring.
- Hook one end of s-hooks to the elastic cord, and then hook the other end of the hook to the aluminum angle on the canopy frame.
- Place hooks between each D-ring on sides and at least three hooks on each end.

TARP MUST BE REMOVED DURING WINTER MONTHS TO PREVENT DAMAGE TO FRAME AND TARP. CANOPY FRAME IS <u>NOT</u> DESIGNED TO HANDLE A SNOW LOAD. WASH AND DRY TARP THOUROUGHLY, THEN FOLD AND STORE INDOORS AWAY FROM RODENTS. RODENTS WILL EAT HOLES THROUGH TARP IF NOT STORED PROPERLY.
